
About BTEC and its Education Curriculum in Bowen Theory





Over the course of her career Amie has worked with humans from all ages and stages. Her studies include the field of microbiology, evolution and other "science stuff" in order to develop her capacity to think broadly. She likes to think about how Bowen Theory posits that human family is a product of evolutionary forces that has more in common with all other forms of life than not.

Teens, Turbulence and...Thinking?!?! Making Sense of Challenge and Navigating Life with Bowen Theory

A recent New York Times article cites the mental health crisis unfolding in teenagers across the country with levels of depression, anxiety, violence and suicidal thoughts reported higher than ever before. Bowen Theory brings an alternative way of thinking that can aid families in the growing challenges of teens and young adults.

This conference will explore how family members are making sense of these big questions: "how can I respond in a responsible way?", "what is the help that is helpful?" and "what does family leadership look like for me?" Amie's presentation will report on what has been learned from families across many contexts and how Bowen Theory provides a way to understand family functioning.

Participants will:

- review key concepts of Bowen theory that relate to family functioning
- examine a model of family functioning through the lens of Bowen Theory.
- compare individual versus systems approach to adolescent/family challenges
- explore case studies and more
